<b>Providing access to the basic needs of life.</b>	
<b>Problem Statement:</b> “A high number of Washington County residents’ are considered to be poor or working poor (42%)* and should be provided access to critical assistance and support to overcome barriers.”	
<b>Goal Statement:</b> United Way will invest Community Impact Funds to support solutions that will overcome barriers and provide basic needs supporting activities of daily living. This may include: food, housing assistance, clothing and access to health care.
